Washington University School of Medicine. The Division of Adult Audiology is seeking a full-time audiologist at our Adult Clinic at **The Central Institute for the Deaf**.

Responsibilities will include:

This position will divide his/her time between providing services for our Adult Audiology Clinic at the Central Institute for the Deaf (CID) (80%) and also serving as an integral part of student clinical education by working with the Program in Audiology and Communication Sciences (PACS) 20%.

For PACS:

- Coordinate clinical placement of all 2nd and 3rd year students for the Fall, Spring and Summer semesters.
- Supervise 1st year students who typically observe patient care in the Adult Clinic at CID.
- Teach a one-hour course/week for the combined 1-3rd year students for the Fall and Spring semesters.

The Responsibilities include:

- Performs/interprets standard/advanced audiometric tests.
- Selects/fits/counseling patients about hearing aids and hearing assistive technology on adult patients.
- Counsels on aural rehabilitation and hearing assistive technology.
- Conducts regular resident teaching sessions, presents monthly physician briefings on research progress, and develops graphic presentations using variety of computer based programs.
- Evaluates central auditory dysfunction, determining level of patient condition and optional treatment methods at our Center for Advanced Medicine (CAM) Clinic
- Supervises Interns and Externs
- Calibrates/maintains audiologic equipment.
- Assists with related administrative and teaching duties.

- The candidate must have a Certificate of Clinical Competence (C-AAA) from ASHA or eligibility for clinical fellowship and Missouri license in audiology.
